Unlike his Conservative opponent, Neil Butters lives in the ward – at South Stoke. He has served as District Councillor for Bathavon South for four years. Before moving to the area in 2004, he served as a Borough Councillor in Swindon for nine years. He also served as a Wiltshire parish councillor for 12 years – twice elected Chairman, including as founder Chairman of Wiltshire's first new parish since its inception.

He has also served two four-year

terms as a school governor, most recently at Ralph Allen School.

He is a member of B&NES Council's Regulatory Access Committee, which deals with rights of way; and is a reserve member of the Development Control (planning) Committee.

Although working full-time, Neil regularly attends meetings of the six parish councils in the ward; also, parish cluster meetings, parish liaison meetings, and PACT meetings (organised by the police).
