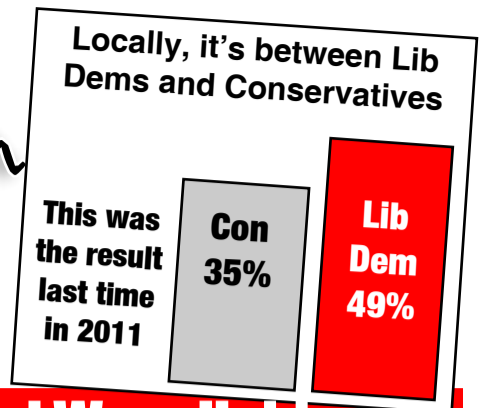

## Core Strategy

Cllr Neil Butters writes: Although I voted against the Core Strategy at the time, nonetheless it drew an important line.

It has been accepted that some 200-300 houses will now be built on the Odd Down - South Stoke plateau.

However, the Government Inspector made it clear – amongst other things - that there should be **no coalescence with South Stoke**, and **no motor vehicle access opposite the Cross Keys**.

I will do all I can to ensure these principles are not breached.
